MATHS

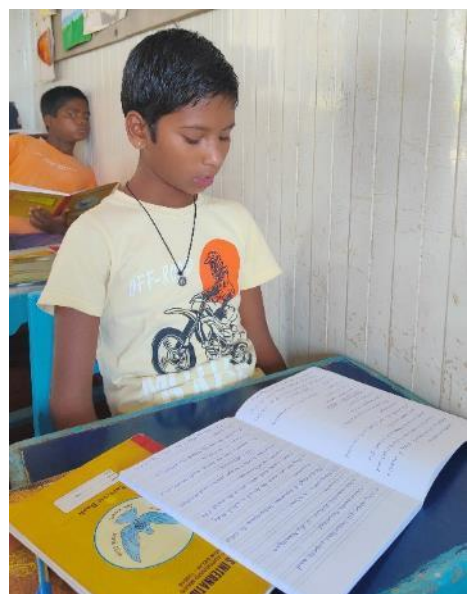


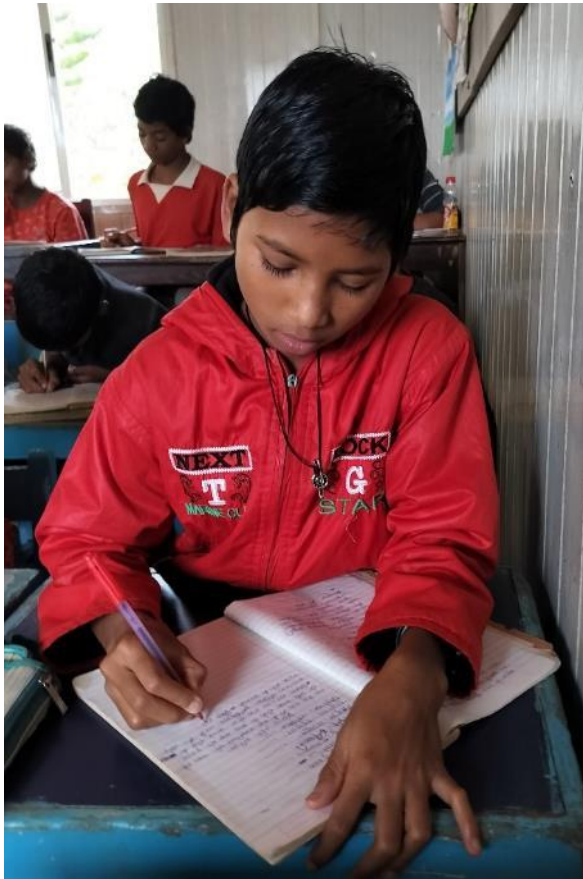

She sometimes struggles with the concepts of "Area" and "Perimeter." Chaiti is currently revising the "Time" chapter. Decimals and fractions are her favourite math topics, made easier by Sangita Didi's explanations to the whole class. Chaiti enjoys playing math games, especially monopoly and mastermind. She is also learning chess from Jagat Bhaiya and classmates. She found abacus initially confusing but gradually improved. She strives to focus and avoid distractions in class to solve more problems efficiently.

ENGLISH

In my English class, I pay attention when didi (teacher) is teaching, but sometimes when I get tired, I find it challenging to concentrate. I am currently studying the English book for the 4th grade. I can understand most of the concepts in the book, but when I can't, I go to didi for help. My spelling, reading, and writing have improved over time.

Initially, I used to do more reading, writing, and dictation, but now I focus more on textbook questions and answers. I have completed the "Good Grammar 3" class,





where I learned about various aspects of grammar, including nouns, pronouns, adjectives, superlative degrees, sentences, and verbs. Sometimes, I also recite poems.

In group reading sessions, I enjoy reading books with my classmates. However, if I get tired or bored, I might take a nap during the session. skills.

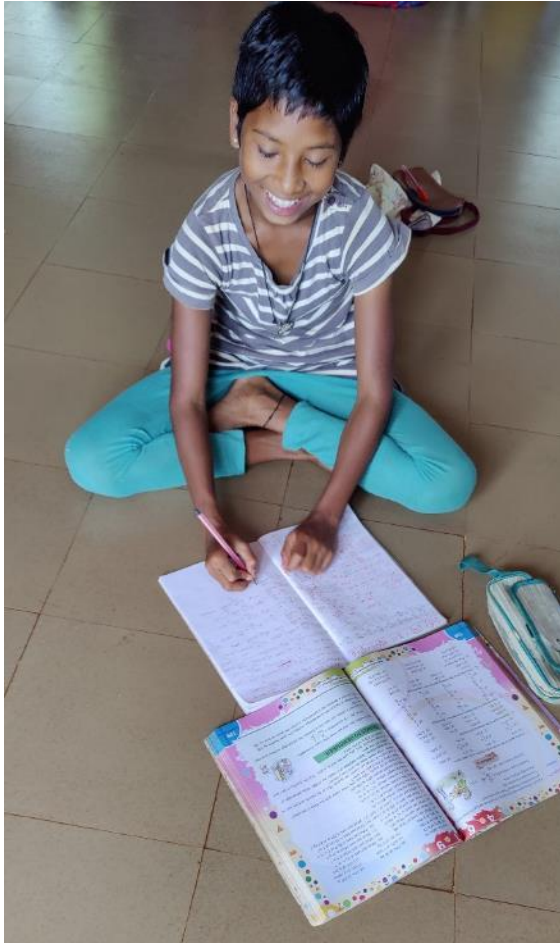

HINDI



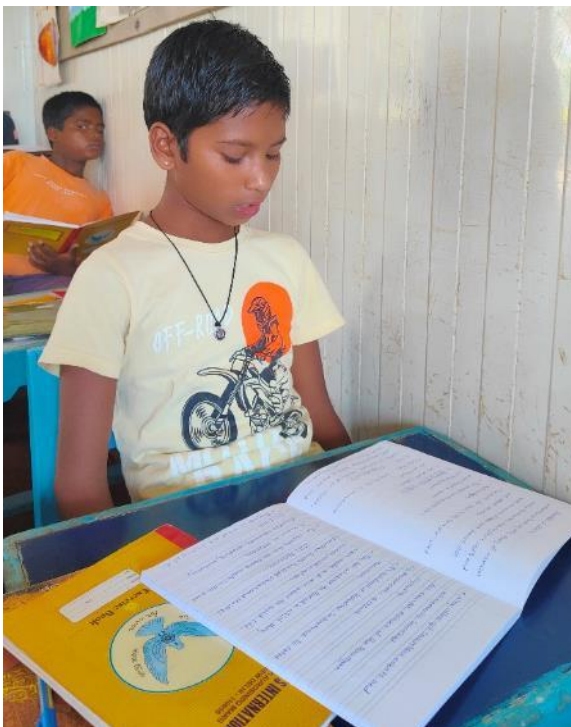

She demonstrates good understanding of grammar, but she occasionally hesitates when the teacher asks questions. Chaiti actively participates in both group reading and free reading activities. Her reading speed is commendable, and in free reading, she explores various books, including "Panchtantra Ki Kahaniyan," "Mehanti Chinti," "Koun Ugaya Kon Khaya," and "Chaalak Lomdi." Chaiti has actively engaged in programs in her Hindi class, including a play on July 5th, where she took on the roles of

Narayandas, narrator, and kasaai. She enjoyed participating in this program with her group, although she required 2-3 days to memorize her lines. She also cherished a dance performance with her classmates on August 15th, despite the relatively short time they had to prepare. On August 31st, she wrote a poem about Rakhi and sang "Dhaagon Ka Ye Rishta" on the same day. Although it took her a week to learn the song, she sang it perfectly on the final day. Chaiti actively seeks help from her teachers when she doesn't understand certain words in her Hindi chapters. She diligently



checks her notebook every day and genuinely enjoys her Hindi class. On festival days, Diyas, her teacher, teaches them songs, and Chaiti is quick to learn these songs.

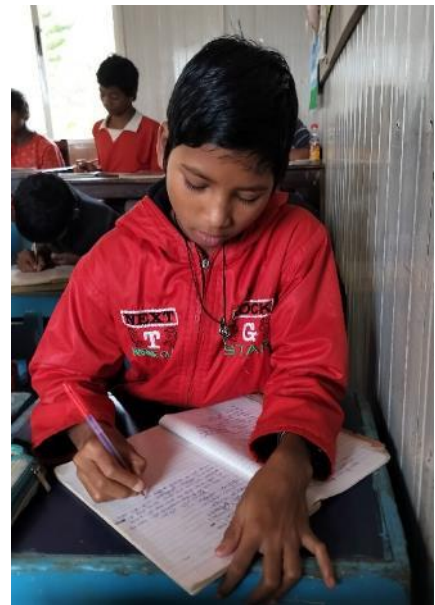
achieved a score of fifteen out of fifty-five in the whole book test. While she
