## **Report for 2022-23 (1<sup>st</sup> Term)**



Bilanti is a smiling girl in the Bliss group. She likes coming to school every day, wearing neat and clean clothes. She can clean herself after using the toilet. She eats all the food nicely and does not waste. During chanting time, she sits nicely with closed eyes and chants all the mantras. She is friendly towards her friends.

### **GAMES**

Bilanti is an active girl who is strong and is always happy. Although she has some problem in her knees, she plays all the games and does the running and

the exercises. She co-operates with all the other children and is very friendly with everybody. As she is very interested in games, she understands the games very fast and plays them very nicely.

### **LANGUAGE (Hindi)**

Bilanti is good at singing; she takes time to learn the lines, but she sings well. When she is learning any new song, her voice is not loud. Bilanti speaks a lot in the class. She tries to create stories by herself - her thinking power is good and she can make stories with drawings in 8 to 10 lines. While narrating the stories, sometimes she uses village language (e.g., squirrel- tilomusa, bhaji - sag and noki etc.). She likes to listen to stories, but is not able to concentrate till the end and starts pinching and talking to her friends. Sometimes, when asked questions related to the story, she is not able to answer. She speaks in the class, but her pronunciation is not good. She faces problems to pronounce kha, ka, ga and hei. (Like khana as kahna, ghar as gar, and hai to yai). For language development, she participates in skits/dramas based on short stories given in books. She participated in a play on Janmashtami, in which she played the role of a villager. She has learnt the colours.



## LANGUAGE (English)

Bilanti has a keen interest in learning English. She likes to sing the rhymes, especially animal rhymes. She sings loudly in a clear voice. However, she takes a little time to catch the lines when new rhymes are taught. Her favourite rhyme is “chai chai”. She also likes to do plays based on short stories. She remembers her dialogues with action very quickly. In assembly, she performs short plays - she did a play titled “The enormous turnip”, in which she had taken the role of a cow. She played her role very nicely and said her dialogues very clearly. When speaking, her pronunciation is clear. In storytelling time, she sits properly and listens to the stories very attentively and tries to understand them.



## MATHS

Bilanti is a brilliant and intelligent girl. She understands the words very fast. She can count backward and forward till 100, tell the after and before number till hundred and recognise the colours with “Ganit Mala”. She can show the numbers in “Ganit Mala”. She always wants to do the activities faster than other children. Sometimes, she is able to answer the word problems on addition, with small numbers. She listens to everything very attentively.



## CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES



Bilanti likes to draw birds, trees, flowers, grass etc. She makes beautiful drawings with good concentration. She has patience while doing quilling. She is able to roll the strip of paper very fast, but she faces difficulty while folding the paper. She is pretty good at quilling; she made some flowers to decorate her group. After finishing her work, she keeps

the things in their respective places. She likes to do cutting and pasting of pictures for the collage. She is



very careful while she is pasting the paper. Bilanti is developing her fine motor skills. She enjoys dancing with music and tries to improve her body movements.



## CELEBRATIONS

Bilanti likes to enact plays. Now her voice is louder and clearer than before. She takes times to remember the dialogues and to pronounce the words. She does not have stage fright - she looks at the audience when she is speaking her dialogues.
