In April, we focused on free reading during class. In group reading, we read the book "The BFG" by Roald Dahl,






and I understood it well and enjoyed it. We also read "Kunnu the Cub," which I liked the most.


On days when we have free reading, I love reading Geronimo Stilton books. I've completed twenty Geronimo Stilton books, and my favourite was "The Rescue of the Town."


the movie "Brave" because it taught me that by persevering, we can achieve






**SOCIAL SCIENCE** Vishesh is another smart boy in the class, who often does well but needs to work hard. He involves himself during the class discussion and questions his doubts






