Report for 2023-24 (First Term)

Introduction



The Peace Group consists of children aged three to four years old who love coming to school regularly and are punctual. The children have now learned songs and chants, including nursery rhymes and mantras, such as "Incy Wincy Spider," "Mene Chuha Pakad Liya," "Aloo Bola Mujhko Khalo," "Teddy Bear Teddy Bear," "Found a Peanut," "Chai Chai," "Blue Bird Blue Bird," "Two Little Dicky Birds," "Pyari Bharat Maa,"

"Tan Ho Sundar," "Red Is Amma's Bindi," "Hai Bhawan Tujhe Pranam," and more. They have also learned chants like "Asatoma Sat Gamaya," "Shri Vakratunda Maha Kaya," "Gurur Brahma," "Om Anandmayee," "Om Bhur Bhuvah Swaha," "Paramach Prabhu Satya," "Trayam Vakm," and "Sahana Vavatu." The teachers

repeat the chants and songs every day as it can be a bit difficult for them to remember. The children concentrate during the chanting period and love to sing while doing actions. They have assembly twice a week in the morning.

Projects

The children have completed

projects on colours, vegetables, and fruits. They were able to learn the names of colours, fruits, and vegetables. They coloured drawings of vegetables, made



vegetable puppets, did paintings of vegetables, and even tried potato stamping. They also had the unique experience of tasting raw vegetables, including bitter melon, cucumber, and onion, to understand their taste before cooking. They performed an exhibition for the Unity Group children about vegetables, and some of the children did well, confidently explaining about various vegetables. In the topic of fruits, they crafted fruits out of clay, enjoying the creative process and quickly learning the names of fruits. Each day, the children would eat a fruit, learning about its



taste, appearance, texture, and sweetness. After learning about the fruits, they would create drawings of the fruits they had learned about, and the children even made finger puppets of the fruits, adding an interactive element with action songs.



Mathematics



In the maths classes, the children have been learning to count, first up to 20, and are currently working on counting up to 30. They are also learning addition and subtraction through stories, making maths enjoyable. The children love working with math-related objects and take pleasure in arranging objects properly. They are capable of matching objects and making comparisons, such as big and small, short and tall, little and more, smooth and rough, and so on. They have also been learning about colours.



Celebrations and Festivals

The children actively participated in various programs and events. On Independence Day, they performed the patriotic song "I Salute My Flag." For Janmashtami, they presented a dance performance titled "Maa Ka Kanhaya Dance." On Rathyatra, they had a great time pulling the rath (chariot) and dancing. On Ganesh Chaturthi, they sang the song "Ek Do Teen Char Ganpati Ki Jai Jai Kar" and performed it well, although some children felt nervous on the stage.
