English:



Shiva is an intelligent student who quickly grasps lessons and is not shy about speaking English. He can speak English fluently, understand English stories, and recreate them in his own words. Shiva is skilled at creating stories and drawings. He has learnt all 26 alphabets, their sounds, and a sound song. He can differentiate between big and small letters, reads two and three-letter words and

simple sentences, and can write his name in English.

Shiva demonstrates proficiency in his studies, having acquired a clear understanding of several alphabets. He is particularly adept at comprehending and narrating stories with confidence. However, when disinterested or fatigued, he may engage in off-task behaviour, fidgeting with his clothes or other objects. Despite his attentive moments, he

still faces challenges in recognising specific letters and perfecting their pronunciation. His learning pace is closely linked to his attentiveness during class. He displays a genuine interest in learning songs and has already mastered "Lehra Do" and "Rakhi Ki Dor."

Water: In the Water topic, Shiva showcased good understanding and could recapitulate many concepts. He actively participated in class discussions and answered questions related to the use of water. He has an appreciation for the importance of water, its sources, the different forms of water, water pollution, filtration of water, solubility, floating and sinking. Shiva enjoyed the activities conducted in this topic, including drawing tasks.

Plant: Shiva is an intelligent student who occasionally struggles with maintaining focus. To improve his concentration, short yoga-related poses are introduced in the first fifteen minutes of each class. In the Plant topic, Shiva learned about various aspects of plants, including distinguishing between trees, shrubs, herbs, and climbers by providing examples. While he isn't very confident, he can still recognize cereals, oilseeds, pulses, and spices. He has an understanding of photosynthesis and the various parts of leaves, flowers, and plants. Air: Shiva had a great performance in the Air topic. He learned a lot and covered various aspects of air, including differentiating between breeze, wind, and storm. He understands the three characteristics of air, which are air has weight, air has pressure, and air occupies space. Shiva can explain the importance of air, differences between air and wind, air as a mixture of gases, air pollution, methods to keep the air clean, and how air carries sound and smell. He created many drawings related to air pollution.

Body: In the Body topic, Shiva displayed enthusiasm but faced a setback due to illness that caused him to miss several classes. However, he has retained knowledge about the names and locations of internal and external organs. He can explain the basic functions of organs such as the brain, heart, arteries, veins, lungs, liver, pancreas, gallbladder, kidneys, intestines, and more. The topic will be revisited after a break to provide Shiva with additional opportunities to learn.

Maths:



Shiva displays a genuine interest in mathematics and while he may take some time to think through problems mentally, his answers are generally accurate. He can count and write numbers up to 1000 using flashcards.

Additionally, Shiva is proficient in identifying the

greatest and smallest 3-digit numbers. His understanding of carryover addition and borrowing subtraction is clear, particularly in written form. Shiva has also learnt expanded form, short form, and the arrangement of numbers in both ascending and descending order. He has actively engaged with length measurement concepts using non-standard units like hand



span, foot span, cubit, and pace, which has resulted in improved estimation skills. Shiva's dedication to learning mathematics is evident in his progress and interest in the subject.

Arts:

Shiva's favourite aspect of art class is paper folding. He often creates kites and balances his time between completing his work and playing with friends. His drawings are related to stories and, while he draws accurately, he tends to use light colouring.



Dance:

Shiva's dance preference is Zumba. While he initially found it challenging to grasp dance steps, he gradually improved. He performed a dance for the 15th of August, "Chak De India," after some repetition of the steps. He was able to overcome difficulties when he felt shy about dancing alone by copying the teachers when they danced in front of him.

Puzzles:

Shiva has a strong interest in puzzle-solving and is consistently punctual. He is open to working on any puzzle and can complete 200-300 piece puzzles with his partner. Shiva maintains concentration and respectful behaviour in the class.



Singing and drama:

Shiva is engrossed in storytelling and enjoys acting stories with his friends. He excels in teaching dialogues and poems to peers, but his engagement depends on his interest. While he sometimes feels sleepy in class, he demonstrates enthusiasm for solo singing and particularly enjoys the song "Una Paloma."
