She is putting efforts to do her best, but sometimes her physical energy, stamina doesn't support her. At times she sleeps in class.

She requires a lot individual attention and encouragement to do her work.

Sometimes she is too distracted and remains busy moving around in the class.

She is coming to the school regularly.



She is not able to shoulder her own responsibility, take care of her clothes, bathe, comb hair, put oil etc.



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English Language - Shamika is one of the jumpiest children in this group, always wanting to do a new thing every 10 minutes if she is not supervised.

She speaks mostly in English except times when she is playful.

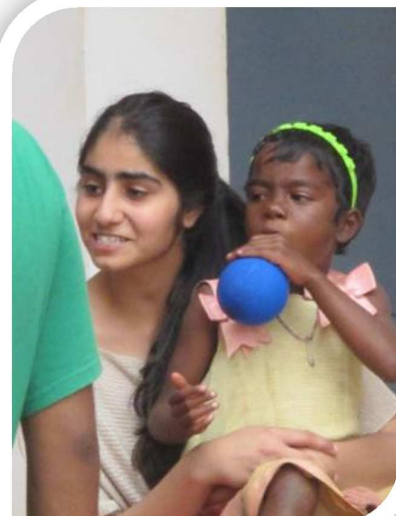


She loves to sing and is often humming songs.

She enjoys guessing word pronunciation from prompt cards and sometimes corrects other children too.



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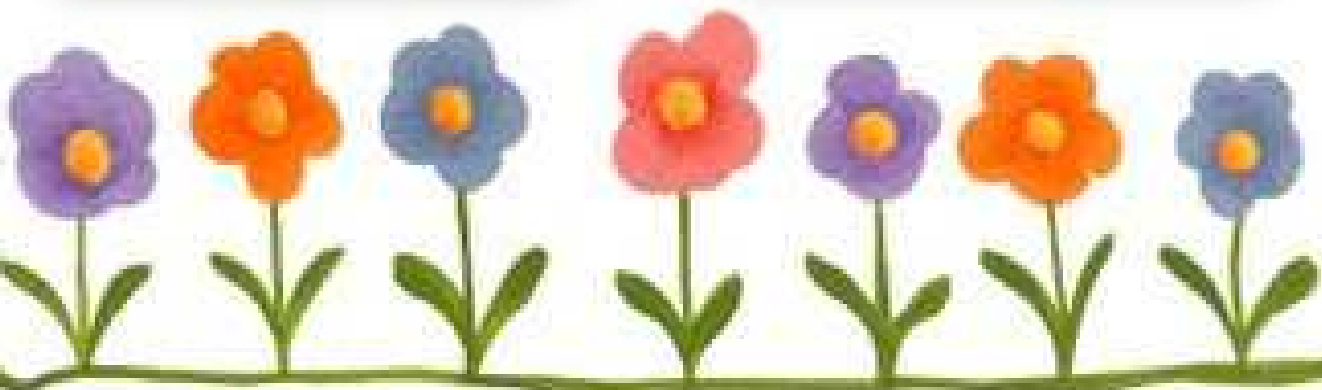


She loves to recount her weekend exploits and often has to be asked to pass on the chance to another child as she can go on for several minutes.

Hindi Language - She has picked up Hindi reading. She enjoys reading but she requires Didi to sit with her continuously otherwise she starts playing.

Shamika is unable to slowly think and describe also. She makes many spelling mistakes in dictation. We are motivating her to read more and listen carefully.

Odia Language - Shamika looks smart but most of the days she feels sleepy after lunch. In fact every Tuesday is more sleepy since she goes home on Monday. She doesn't have any interest to learn Odia. She needs to do effort to learn something. Her interest is more in sleeping and gossiping.



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Math: Shamika's interest and disinterest in Math depends on her mood. When she is in good mood, she can do addition and subtraction (carrying and borrowing) otherwise it's not easy to convince her to do math.

Sometimes she says I don't know how to do though she has already done similar problems several times.

Math class is in the afternoon and most of the time Shamika falls asleep during class.

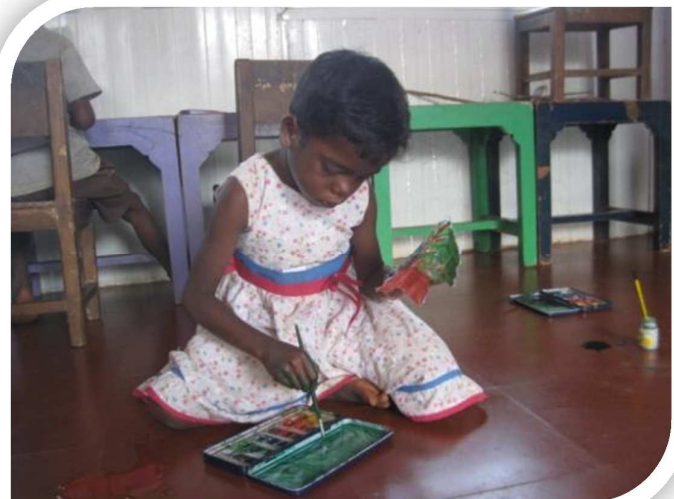
She can arrange numbers up to hundred in ascending and descending order. She responds to questions of number after, before and in between.

Projects: Shamika needs special attention to understand the theme of any topic.

Skill work: She prefers to draw, paint, cut-paste and make objects by folding paper.

She is fully engaged while doing skill based activities.

Most of the time, she keeps herself away from skill related games such as kicking, passing, catching, throwing; after sometime she starts collecting leaves, sticks or swings on the trees.
