All the children in the group are not only responsible but also organized, friendly and cooperative, both with the group diyas as well as with each other. Though Maths and English is a favourite subject with many of them, they also like to read Hindi books in the library.



Art: - Though both boys and girls are encouraged to dance, only the girls seem to be open to dancing. The group is also keen to learn fresh songs and enjoy music immensely. On the other hand the boys want to try their hand at making toys and boats. The children also enjoy drawing pictures of the village and nature. After drawing anything, they are keen to have their work displayed. The children enjoy also enjoy drama.



Project work

During the last few months the children have worked on a few topics and they enjoyed working on them. Some of these topics are:

<u>Time</u>

The aim of taking up time as a project was to understand it better so that work could be carried out on time and in the process the children would learn to value the significance of keeping to time while they undertake any work.

What was done :

They children were asked to write and draw pictures about what they didi from morning to night. They were introduced to a.m and p.m as well as minutes, seconds, hours and a calendar. The group also observed shadows and watched the change from morning to afternoon to evening . They were also made to understand how time moved from hours to minutes and seconds as well as from days to weeks to months and finally an entire year.

Measurement


The aim was that the children should understand measurement. They were told about different ways of measuring. Centimetres, metres, feet, inches, kilometres etc were also taught to them. These concepts were also put forth by explaning how a tailor would measure the cloth before stitching a dress or how the vegetable vendor always measures and then sells the vegetables.

The children then measured all the items in their classrooms like pencils, boxes, chairs, tables, crayons, books, notebooks with a scale. The children were also asked to measure the various display boards and the verandas in the school and this was really exciting for them.



<u>Money</u>

Money was also introduced to the group through coins and notes. However, they took some time to completely understand how to use money properly.
