Maths

When she encounters a word problem she doesn't understand, she asks the teacher to read it for her, which helps her grasp the concept more easily. She has a clear understanding of division but finds borrowing in subtraction challenging, particularly with three-digit problems. Encouraging her to practice with larger numbers in written form will help build her confidence and skills. She takes time to understand the process of finding the dividend and the roles of the dividend, divisor, quotient, and remainder. Although she took time to grasp the concept of fractions, she can divide figures into equal parts and write



fractions for shaded and unshaded areas. She enjoys using coloured paper strips to express one-half, one-third, and one-fourth, and she can use the term "quarter" interchangeably with "one-fourth." Through games, she has also learnt about numerators and denominators.



Arts



Khushi is a dedicated student who approaches her work with great care and commitment. Although she learns things a bit slowly, she ensures that her final results are executed properly. However, she struggles with paper folding, often finding her folds to be inaccurate. In art class, she is attentive and actively listens to her teacher, which helps her improve over time.
