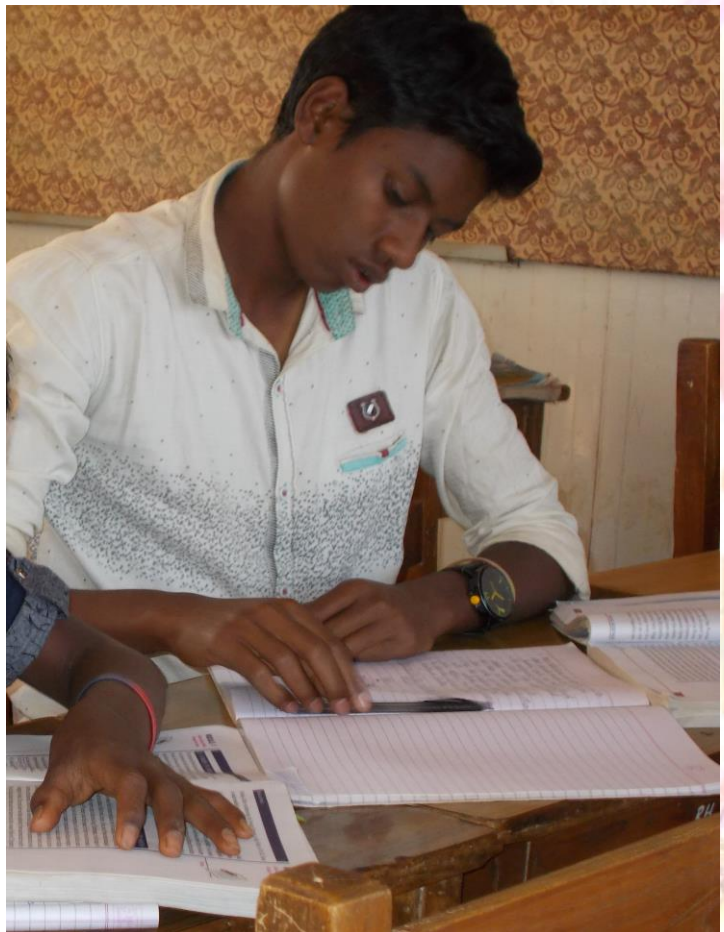
## *English:*

Then we went to a Fish Aquarium and saw fishes, snakes, turtles and many dead fishes as well. I saw many kinds of fishes swimming in the aquarium. I liked to see the fishes and the creatures of the sea.

After this, we went to the Science Museum by a government bus. We got to know a lot about Andama
